## Spring Clean Up

To encourage spring cleanup, 12 Mile Disposal customers will be allowed the equivalent of five, 30-gallon trash cans free of charge on their regular trash pick-up day during the week of May 20<sup>th</sup>. Also, the City of Fairview has arranged with Allwood Recyclers, at no cost to you, for residents to drop off up to two cubic yards of yard debris during the month of May 2013. (See coupon)

Allwood Recyclers is located at 23001 NE Marine Drive in Fairview. Residents must present a coupon and Fairview identification to be eligible.

## Fairview Budget Committee Approves Proposed Budget for Fiscal Year 2013-14 with a Few Additions...

The Fairview Budget Committee approved the Proposed Budget for Fiscal Year 2013-14 with a few additions. The Committee approved the use of resources from the Photo Enforcement Program to fund the addition of a 15<sup>th</sup> police officer to the Fairview Police Department. The Committee also approved the use of General Fund Reserves to purchase rifles and rifle night sights for the Police Department. Finally, the committee approved the moving of \$500,000 from the General Fund Reserves into the General Fund Contingency in order to pursue the retirement of the Water Revenue Refunding Bond Series 2004 on behalf of the Water Fund.

The Fairview City Council will consider the adoption of the Committee Approved Budget for Fiscal Year 2013-14 at its' June 5th City Council meeting. A public hearing regarding the approved budget will be held at that time. The Committee Approved Budget is available on the City webpage as well as in the Administration/Finance Department of City Hall.

## Yikes! There's moss on my roof

Roof tops shaded by trees are the ideal location for moss to flourish. Most growth occurs in winter when there is plenty of water, little light and low temperatures. Sunny, dry conditions cause moss to dry out and become dormant until the next moisture cycle comes along. Spring and summer are the ideal times to tackle moss removal. Start with physical measures. Prune overhanging trees to allow light and air circulation. Regularly remove leaves and branches to reduce moisture retention. Carefully remove moss with a stiff broom, wire brush or pressure washer. Too much pressure or force can damage shingles. If physical measures aren't enough, consider herbicidal soaps that contain potassium salts or fatty acids. They are among the least-toxic methods of moss control. The active ingredient in these soaps causes moss to become dehydrated and die. Less desirable are zinc- and copper-based products that are potentially a risk to aquatic organisms and should not be used if roof runoff has a direct path to a storm drain, stream or lake.
