Planning Commission seeks Citizen and Community Input for Riverfront Zone

October 8, 2013 and October 22, 2013

Council wishes to explore potential for Riverfront Development in Fairview

At a recent joint meeting of the City Council and Planning Commission, it was determined that the Planning Commission would conduct a series of information gathering meetings on the potential and interest in rezoning the riverfront for mixed use. If this concept was to materialize, it would create commercial and residential opportunities on the Columbia River. Five properties would potentially be impacted and the property owners' level of interest and concurrence would be specifically solicited as part of the process. It is envisaged that such a zone along the riverfront would allow for condominium style housing, restaurant opportunities, and a marina, as well as incorporating the natural resources and beauty of the views of the Columbia River. The effect of any rezone would allow the continuation of existing uses, but would preclude any expansion of the existing industrial activities on the various sites. The first of the informational gathering sessions is set for October 8th 2013, and we encourage our residents to attend and let the Planning Commission know your thoughts on this proposed strategy. Photo Red Light Safety Program: One Year in Review

The Fairview Police Department Photo Red Light Enforcement Program began on May 4, 2012, issuing warnings (as required by law). We began issuing citations on June 3, 2013.

The first FULL twelve months of operation (issuing citations) would be July 1, 2012 through June 31, 2013. In July 2012 a total of 259 citations were issued compared to 116 citations issued twelve months later in the month of July 2013. This is a 55.21% reduction in the number of issued citations.

Accident Information:

When we conducted our initial research regarding accidents at Fairview Parkway and Halsey we obtained data from the Oregon Department of Transportation. We learned that there were 12 accidents at that intersection in a four year ten month period (prior to the installation of the cameras). Sixty-seven (67) percent of the accidents resulted in injuries. One, in particular, was initially classed as a possible fatality because the doctors told us the female driver would not survive (she did survive). During the first twelve months of full operation with the photo radar cameras at Fairview Parkway there are two important facts: 1) there has not been one year end collision attributed to the red light cameras, and 2) there were a total of three accidents- resulting in ZERO percent injuries. Those accidents were a result of the following: 1) a driver adjusting radio, saw car next to him go so he went and bumped in to car in front of him, 2) driver turning on green light did not see a bicyclist and bumped the rider at slow speed, and 3) drunk driver hits a light pole 100 plus feet from the intersection.

The statistics would indicate that we are gaining much better compliance for citizens stopping safely at the red light at Fairview Parkway and Halsey.
