Applications for this important position are available in the City Hall Administration/Finance Department or on the city website under “City Forms and Documents” and then click on “Boards & Commission Application.”

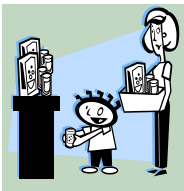

Sidewalk Repair Grant Assistance Program is Now Available

The Sidewalk Repair Grant Assistance Program utilizes limited funds collected in the Street Fund. The funds are available on a first come/first serve basis and limited to the budgeted amount. A citizen can apply for a grant of up to \$6.00 per square foot (contractor or material costs) of replaced sidewalk if the sidewalk is identified as a trip hazard by the City based upon the standards outlined in the [Sidewalk Maintenance Program Handbook - Policy and Operating Guidelines](#) and the [FMC 12.05](#).

Christmas Tree Recycling

With the holiday season right around the corner, it is time to begin decorating our homes. When it comes to Christmas Trees, you might consider using a live tree that can be planted later in your yard or donated to a local school, church or other organization. If you plan on using a more traditional tree, please plan ahead to recycle it at the end of the holiday season in early January 2014. In Fairview, our local franchised hauler, Twelve Mile Disposal, will collect your Christmas trees after the holidays. Please place the undecorated tree at the curbside on your normal collection day. If the tree is over 8 feet please cut in half or break down and place in the yard debris container. Business owners and apartment managers should contact Twelve Mile Disposal at 503.661.0255 directly to make arrangements to have Christmas trees picked up and recycled. If you are a tenant, please be sure to ask your manager to arrange for this service.
