

Fiscal Year 2014-15 Budget Scheduled for Public Hearing and Adoption on June 18, 2014

A public meeting of the Fairview City Council will be held on June 18, 2014 at 7:00 pm in the Fairview City Hall Council Chambers at 1300 NE Village Street, Fairview, Oregon. The purpose of this meeting is to discuss the budget for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2014 as approved by the Fairview Budget Committee. A copy of the budget may be inspected or obtained at Fairview City Hall Administration/Finance Department, 1300 NE Village Street, Fairview, Oregon, between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. or online at fairvieworegon.gov.

This budget is for an annual budget period. This budget was prepared on a basis of accounting that is the same as used the preceding year. The total budget for Fiscal Year 2014-15 for the City of Fairview is \$18,527,897.

Mayor Position and Four City Councilor Positions on the November 4, 2014 Election Ballot

The Fairview City Council has five positions which will be on the November 4, 2014 election ballot. The positions are:

- Mayor Position- *currently held by Mike Weatherby*
- Council Position 2- *currently held by Ted Tosterud (the person elected to this position will complete the term which expires on 12-31-16)*
- Council Position 4- *currently held by Steve Owen*
- Council Position 5- *currently held by Lisa Barton Mullins*
- Council Position 6- *currently held by Tamie Arnold*

All elected positions are for a period of 4 years, with the exception of position 2 which is open due to a mid-term resignation of a prior city councilor. The person elected to position 2 will serve for the remainder of the existing term which expires on December 31, 2016. To qualify to be a candidate an elector shall have resided in the City of Fairview for a period of 12 months immediately preceding the City election.

The first day to file for candidacy with the City Recorder is June 4, 2014 and the last day to file is August 26, 2014 by 5:00 pm.
