Fairview Police Offer New and Improved Public Access to Crime Reporting

Curious about the activities of the police in your neighborhood? You can sign up for a FREE service to receive reports on police activities in your neighborhood or anywhere in Fairview.

Fairview Police has partnered with CrimeReports.com to offer this free service. Simply log on to CrimeReports.com and sign up to review calls for police service in the area you specify. Features of the service include:

- Receive daily, weekly or monthly reports on your mobile device
- Select a date range for viewing police activity
- Select if you want to include sex offender locations

Advance search capabilities allow the user to narrow or expand the location range and types of calls they wish to view. (The information usually posts within 24 hours of the incident).

It is important to note that the incidents are police calls for service as received by the Bureau of Emergency Communications (9-1-1 Center) and do not always reflect the final disposition of an incident as determined after investigation by a police officer.
