Mayor's Thoughts....On Wednesday June 17th your city council approved a Solid Waste Disposal fee increase. Twelve Mile Disposal has been our collection company for over 60 years. They requested a fee increase due to the continuing increases in the cost of disposing of solid waste (tipping fees) and comingled recycling. The last rate adjustment was in 2011. This increase is to offset the substantial increase in the cost of disposing of solid waste and the dramatic shift in the costs associated with comingled recycling. The average household's increase will be \$1.77 and commercial \$6.32 per ton. If you have any questions about this increase please give me a call.

Also at Wednesday night's council meeting our City Administrator, Samantha Nelson, presided over her last council meeting. She has worked as City Administrator for Fairview since 2008 and was our finance director before that. Samantha is moving on to her dream career working for Gladstone School District as the Director of Finance and Operations.

I have enjoyed working with Samantha these past 18 months and will miss her. She has been my right hand and her support and patience has helped me grow into my new position as Mayor. Hot weather is coming - tips for watering wisely

- ◆ Water before 10am or after 6pm when the temperatures are cooler and there is less evaporation.
- ◆ Established landscaping and lawns don't need to be watered more than twice a week. Watering thoroughly but infrequently helps roots go deeper and results in a more water-efficient landscape. Lawns need an average of an inch of water a week.
- ◆ Water your potted plants and hanging baskets with left over water glasses, and other "waste" water.
- ◆ Using a watering-can can reduce the amount of water you use and get it exactly where it needs to go.
- ◆ Always stop if you see puddling and allow the water to soak into the soil.
