FOUR CITY COUNCILOR POSITIONS ON THE NOVEMBER 8, 2016 ELECTION BALLOT

The Fairview City Council has four Councilor positions which will be on the November 8, 2016 election ballot. The positions are:

Council Position 1 - currently held by Dan Kreamier

Council Position 2 - currently held by Ed Bejarana

Council Position 3 - currently held by Steve Prom

Council Position 4 - currently held by Tamie Arnold



All elected positions are for a period of 4 years, with the exception of position four which is open due to a mid-term resignation of a prior city councilor. The person elected to position 4 will serve for the remainder of the existing term which expires on December 31, 2018.

To qualify to be a candidate an elector shall have resided in the City of Fairview for a period of 12 months immediately preceding the City election.

HELLO FAIRVIEW

Community; Community is when individuals come together for the common good. We in Fairview are a community. One of the quality of life issues that communities become involved in is the health, safety and appearance of our community. How we as individuals take care of our part of the community, the property on which we live, affects all of us. The Fairview Budget Committee and City Council have made this a priority. We have ordinances that set the standard we are all to live by, but not the resources to address the issues that arise. The budget for the new year includes funds to hire a part time Code Compliance Officer. The person filling this position will start working for the City on August 15, 2016. Their responsibility is to educate individuals as to what the standard is, why it is a good neighbor policy to follow that standard and ways to bring ones property in compliance with the standard. If that does not bring about compliance we will start the enforcement part of the process.

As an example keeping of Roosters within city limits is not allowed. Roosters tend to make noise at inappropriate times and disturb the peace in the community. If we become aware a resident has a Rooster we would contact them and let them know that this is not allowed because it disturbs the peace of the community and help them identify ways to remove the Rooster from the community. If the Rooster remains, then we would begin the process of citing the owner for a violation of the ordinance and eventually if the Rooster remains, remove it from the community. This is all done for the best of the community.

During the following months we will include additional articles in the Fairview Point on what our community standards are so we can all work hard at being good neighbors.
