“If I Were Mayor” 2016-17 OMA Student Contest

Fairview Mayor Ted Tosterud wants to know what students would do for their city if they were Mayor. The winners of the Fairview contest will be recognized at the televised May 3, 2017 City Council meeting, and advance to the statewide competition. The Oregon Mayor’s Association (OMA) is sponsoring the annual statewide contest.

The contest consists of 3 categories:

- poster entries - grades 4-5;
- essay entries - middle school; and
- digital media presentation - high school.

A local winner will be selected for each category. The submission deadline for **Fairview's local contest is April 14, 2017**. Winners will advance to the statewide competition. The statewide winners in each category will receive an Apple iPad Air 2 tablet at the OMA Annual Conference July 27-29, 2017. Entry forms at www.fairvieworegon.gov.

Out and About with Ray Hansen - City of Fairview Parks

There are 20 individual parks within the City of Fairview. Each park has a bench for the visitor to sit, relax, and enjoy gardens and landscape in the surrounding area.

Thirteen small Pocket Parks are located within the City of Fairview, including Fezett, Windstorm, Pioneer, Greenridge, Stone, Icicle, Gumdrop, and Langley in Fairview Village and Crossroads, Handy, 2nd Street, and Marilyn’s Park in Historic Old Town; and Hockaday Park by Fairview Lake. All are destinations for relaxation and recreational walking.

Fairview has three beautiful Neighborhood Parks, including Park Cleone in Historic Old Town, and Lakeshore Park and Pelfrey Park in the Fairview Lake area. All have playground and picnic areas, in addition to paths for recreational walking.

Open Space Parks include Salish Ponds Wetland Park, Indian John Park, and Fairview Woods, which have walking trails and provide excellent venues for viewing nature.

Fairview Community Park also has a playground, picnic areas, and a pavilion available for public and private events.


