Budget Committee Meetings Coming in May

The Fairview Budget Committee will meet on Monday's in May at 6:00 PM to deliberate over the proposed budget for the fiscal year 2017-18. The first meeting will take place Monday, May 1, 2017. The Budget Committee is comprised of a 14 member volunteer committee, 7 City Councilors and 7 citizen representatives. All of these meetings are open to the public.



Sidewalk In-Fill

The Fairview City Council at their March 15 meeting reviewed the results of two public meetings and 84 surveys on the construction of sidewalks in areas where there are none. Survey results indicated 36% supported construction of new sidewalks, with 31% willing to help pay for the cost.



The Council has decide to only construct new sidewalks on neighborhood streets where the property owners would be willing to pay for half of the cost or where the street is eligible for grant funding. The City Council also directed City Staff to develop and pursue a plan for obtaining sidewalks on the west side of 223rd from Halsey to Blue Lake Road where they are currently missing. Spring Clean Up

To encourage spring cleanup, 12 Mile Disposal customers will be allowed the equivalent of five, 30-gallon trash cans free of charge on their regular trash pick-up day during the week of May 15th.



The City of Fairview has also arranged with Allwood Recyclers, at no cost to you, for residents to drop off up to two cubic yards of yard debris during the month of May 2017. (No sod or dirt will be accepted). Allwood Recyclers is located at 23001 NE Marine Drive in Fairview. Residents must present a coupon and Fairview identification to be eligible. Look for the Allwood coupon in May's Fairview Point.

Community Garden

Do you want to spend time preparing the soil, planting, maintaining, and harvesting plants and vegetables? Community Garden plots are located in Park Cleone and each plot contains two raised beds with water provided on site. A yearly fee of \$25.00 is charged per garden plot, and only one garden plot will be assigned per family. Garden plots will be assigned on a first come, first serve basis. If you are interesting in reserving a plot at the Community Garden and would like to receive a garden application form please call 503-665-9320. You may also stop in at City Hall to pick up a garden application Monday through Friday between 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. at the Public Works counter located on the second floor.
