



**PSAC MEETING MINUTES**

November 20, 2017

Minutes of prior meeting's minutes were approved.

Citizens Wishing to Speak on Non-Agenda Items: None. At that time Mr. Murrell noted MCSO was doing a good job in towing vehicles that were abandoned and noted a transient RV that parked near the Hyster plant that was quickly tagged and then moved toward the Drainage District property near Marine Dr. Chief Smith noted that MCSO Patrol worked with METRO to get that RV moved along. Mr. Murrell noted there was a non-working car parked by Fairview Elementary that needs attention. Chief Smith will pass that along to day shift patrol. Mr. Murrell also noted he was pleased with service of the Deputy who came to take possession of two guns he wished to have destroyed.

Chief's Report:

Chief Smith updated the PSAC regarding the complaints made by the citizen at the last meeting. The citizen did come in to the next Council meeting and gave essentially the same accounts to Council. Allan Berry and Chief Smith after the Council meeting examined the bridge and greenspace in question and found minimal vandalism (two graffiti tags and one light out/not vandalized). A daytime examination of the area found the area to transient encampment. Public Works has since repaired the trail light. MCSO Patrol has been informed of the complaint and will remain vigilant for issues there. Chief Smith has spoken to other neighbors and encouraged people to report all suspicious activities in the area.

Chief Smith was able to secure the Red Cross to conduct a public presentation on disaster preparedness on Thursday December 14<sup>th</sup>. There will be an on-line sign up again and a flyer will be put out in the December water bill. Chief Smith will continue to publicize the event with his presentations and with City apartment complexes.

Chief Smith updated on recent public outreach meetings held over the last month to include Fairview Woods/Oaks, Fairview Village Ladies' Tea. The outreach efforts will continue with Fairview Terrace on December 7 and two other apartment complexes (date to be set).

MCSO Sgt. Matt Jordan provided a briefing to PSAC about the mission of the Homeless Outreach and Programs Engagement (HOPE) Team. He highlighted the multi-disciplinary philosophy of the team and some of their successes in East County.
