Public Safety News

The City of Fairview, in coordination with the Multnomah County Sheriff's Office and the Fairview Public Safety Advisory Committee, has been planning for a number of community crime prevention events in 2018. The first major event will be an ID theft prevention/document shredding event held at Fairview City Hall on Saturday April 7, 2018 from 10 AM to 1 PM. ID theft is a continuing problem throughout our community and our nation. There has been a lot of focus of protecting your identity on-line, and rightly so. However, in focusing on our digital identity protection we can sometimes forget the "old school" methods of stealing personal information via mail documents, receipts, or other paper documents that contain sensitive personal information. It is important to protect your "analog" identity by securely shredding sensitive documents.



During our shred event, you can bring up to two "banker" sized boxes, per household, of personal or business documents to shred securely on site at City Hall. While this is a free event, we ask that you bring some canned food or other non-perishable food items to donate to the Oregon Food Bank. In one fell swoop you get to protect yourself from ID theft and feed hungry neighbors here in East Multnomah County; it doesn't get much better than that! Please mark your calendars now for this document shred event.

On another crime prevention note, if you are engaging in on-line sales and need a safe location to conduct the purchase/exchange, don't forget that we have a safe-exchange site on the Village Street side of City Hall that is under video surveillance 24 hours a day. The spot is located right in front of the building and marked with a sign.

I would also encourage residents of Fairview to attend the monthly meetings of the Public Safety Advisory Committee. The PSAC is made up of citizens, City Council liaison, and your Police Chief. We discuss current issues, plan public-safety and disaster/emergency preparedness events, and have presentations regarding the public safety services available here in Fairview. The meetings are generally held on the third Monday of each month at City Hall at 6:30 p.m., but please check the City's website calendar for the exact date and time of each month's meetings. These meetings are a great opportunity to hear about what is going on in the community and bring forward issues you think need to be addressed to make our city a more livable community.

Finally, since the City of Fairview contracted policing services with the Multnomah County Sheriff's Office last August, we have fielded a few questions about services the Sheriff's Office provides including vacation house checks, obtaining a copy of a police report, or the various units serving your community.
