Approval of Minutes

Chief's Report

Chief James Eriksen recapped the April 2020 LE Activity Report. The May 2020 LE Activity was distributed to the PSAC members on June 16 and will be discussed at the July PSAC meeting.

Old Business

- Shred Day was discussed for the Fall. It was agreed to see if the Shred company was available for an October 10th shred event. Chief Eriksen will e-mail the City to see if this date is possible (e-mail sent on June 16). It was also discussed that food donations would still occur and the PSAC Committee will firm up plans on how to safely receive the food during the pandemic. The Committee also discussed plans to make sure physical distancing occurs at this upcoming event.
- There was a discussion of a virtual neighborhood watch meeting and possibly having this at the end of June.
- Matney Street Update – Chief Eriksen said MCSO Sgt. Gary Kirby met with Chelsea Jones in late April 2020 and discussed the options available for the concerns with stalking order. Chelsea Jones attended the April PSAC meeting and discussed her concerns during non-agenda items. There haven't been any reported issues relating to this matter since late April.
- Salish Ponds Update – Chair Steve Marker said he has spoke with Fairview Public Works Director Allan Berry about Salish Ponds and was advised that the ODFW will not be restocking the pond with fish.

New Business

- COVID-19 – There was a discussion with the Committee and Mayor Cooper about Townsend Farms and the high rate of workers testing positive for COVID-19. Mayor Cooper said the City is working closely with the Oregon Health Authority and there is testing occurring with the workers.
- MCSO HOPE Team (houseless outreach team) will be giving a presentation to the City Council on June 17 at 6pm and Chief Eriksen invited the PSAC members to attend (zoom meeting)

- Chief Eriksen said MCSO Sheriff Reese and his staff will be compiling information addressing Diversity Training, Equity Initiatives, Policies and Community Engagement Partnerships to share with the City of Fairview.
- There were concerns of speeders in the Village and 223 area of Fairview. Citizen's were commenting on social media about this concern. Chief Eriksen mentioned that a speed study was conducted and he is reviewing it for assigning to MCSO patrol for follow-up.


Meeting was adjourned at 6:57 p.m.
