Hello to all, this seems to be the season to get things done and move forward. I will be presenting my State of the City speech on March 6th at the City Council meeting and invite all to attend or watch it on Comcast channel 30.

To continue moving Fairview forward as a regional leader, I recently called a meeting of the city councils of all four east county cities, which we hosted at the Fairview City Hall. Attendance and participation was great, but I was sorry to see that only two City Councilors from the City of Gresham attended. We discussed the upcoming tax levy that METRO is pushing. The discussion was lively and it is to be noted that neither I, nor your city council, support the tax, particularly with METRO representatives stating that this would be just the first of several levies that they would be presenting to the public to support their green spaces. Another issue that requires the Mayors of the four cities to work together and give total support, is retaining

financial support from Multnomah County for the east county booking center. I have heard that the County Chair plans to stop funding this invaluable tool that is vital for our police departments. I would ask all of our citizens to let the County Chair know that we care about this issue.

Next, I have called a meeting of the city councils of Fairview, Troutdale and Wood Village to discuss service sharing. The question is, are there services that each city provides that could be shared yet continue to provide excellent service to our citizens and save money now or in the future by sharing them instead of each city duplicating them.

You will be hearing the results of the meeting, and again, it will be a public meeting open to one and all to watch.

FAIRVIEW POLICE SELECT 2013 "OFFICER OF THE YEAR"

Each year the employees of the Fairview Police Department can nominate one of their fellow employees for "Officer of the Year." Employees then vote on the nominations. The 2013 Fairview Police Department Officer of the Year is Officer Brad Robertson.

Officer Robertson was serving as the departments' only detective when he answered the call to help fill a critical position in the East Metro Gang Enforcement Team (EMGET). When ten year old Miranda Crockett was killed late last year, Officer Robertson did not hesitate to take the lead and spearhead the difficult and complex investigation.

In addition to serving on EMGET, Officer Robertson is often called upon by members of this department and other East County agencies due to his Spanish speaking abilities. In his spare time, he is President of the Fairview Police Officers' Association and volunteers for the Special Olympics.

Officer Robertson was also voted the 2011 Officer of the Year making him the first ever repeat award recipient. Congratulations Brad.

Liz Sinclair, Utility Billing Clerk and Erika Fitzgerald, Development Analyst have joined the Fairview Team. SPRING BACKYARD BURN SEASON STARTS MARCH 1

Spring burn season runs from March 1– June 15, 2013. However, only 10 burn days per season are allowed. The first burn day for Fairview, Wood Village, and Gresham is Saturday, April 20th.

Citizens can call 503-618-3083 for additional burn information. You must call this number to determine if DEQ is going to allow the burn on a scheduled day and the hours that burning is allowed.
