ABUSE PREVENTION ACT  
INFORMATION ORS 133.055(3)

IF YOU ARE THE VICTIM OF  
DOMESTIC VIOLENCE:

You can ask the district attorney to file a criminal complaint.

You also have the right to go to the circuit court and file a petition requesting any of the following orders for relief:

- An order restraining your attacker to leave your household;
- An order preventing your attacker from entering your residence, school, business, or place of employment;
- An order awarding you or the other parent custody of/or parenting time with a minor child or children;
- An order restraining your attacker from molesting or interfering with minor children in your custody;
- An order awarding you other relief the court considers necessary to provide for you or your children's safety. Including emergency monetary relief.

Such orders are enforceable in every state.

You may also request an order awarding support for minor children in your care, or for your support if the other party has legal obligations to support you or your children. You also have the right to sue for losses suffered as a result of the abuse, including medical and moving expenses, loss of earnings or support, and other damage to your property. This can be done without an attorney in small claims court if the total amount claimed is under \$3500.

Similar relief may also be available in tribal courts.

**THIS PROBLEM WILL  
NOT GO AWAY BY  
ITSELF!**

Most domestic abuse situations do not solve themselves without professional intervention (counseling, drug/alcohol rehabilitation programs, or legal proceedings.) When you do not report this unlawful behavior, for whatever reason, you allow the violence to continue and to escalate.

You must talk to someone. A list of local resources is included in this brochure. You can call anonymously to get information.

## RESTRAINING ORDERS

You may be eligible for a restraining order if you have been:

1. Either of the following:
  - Physically injured or threatened with in the past 180 days;
  - Caused to engage in involuntary sexual relations by force or threat of force.

### AND

2. You meet at least one of the following relationship criteria:
  - A spouse or former spouse of the respondent;
  - Adult related by blood, marriage, or adoption to the respondent;
  - Live with or have lived with the respondent;
  - Have engaged in a sexually intimate relationship with this respondent within the last two years;
  - You are a parent, with the respondent, of a minor child.
