New Playground Equipment Installed at Park Cleone



Park Cleone (at the north end of 213th Street) has a large new play structure. The play structure is designed to be ADA compliant and city crews will be installing pathways to ensure wheelchairs can easily access the play structure as well. The equipment was chosen in large part by a group of elementary school children who presented their recommendations to Council in June. The City Public Works Department, GR Morgan Construction, and volunteers (including a City Council President Barton Mullins and City Councilor Quinby) installed the equipment. Curbing for the site was donated by Phoenix Curb Machines. Come out and play!
