

Greetings, The Sheriff invited me to coffee this last week with a proposal, that a conversation be initiated regarding the option of the Sheriff Department taking on the responsibility of providing police services for the city of Fairview. This led to another meeting with the Sheriff at which I invited Samantha Nelson, Chief Johnson, and three council members. At this meeting the Sheriff made a presentation as to the enhanced services that his office could provide, and the possibility of substantial cost saving, plus covering additional information, and responding to several questions.

Now, much of what was discussed was of a general nature, and Sheriff Stanton talked about the more advanced negotiations that he is having with the City of Troutdale re-

garding the option of the Sheriff providing police services for that city. Also, nothing will take place until the Sheriff is prepared to meet with our city council and continue a discussion of a Sheriff's proposal specific to Fairview. If the council desires to look further at this matter, the council could ask the administration to provide a cost analysis of the potential savings that would result. You can be assured that whatever takes place, you all will be kept informed, many, many questions will be asked, and there will be opportunities for public input.
