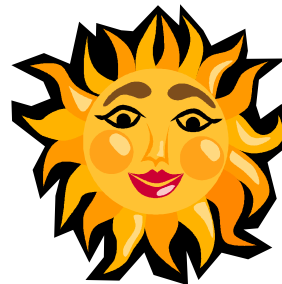

When you step into these historic structures, you will be transported in time by objects that traveled the Oregon Trail in the 1850's, maps of early Fairview (known as Cleone in the early days), and many other artifacts of life in East Multnomah County.

Please visit us soon--our summer hours are every Saturday from noon - 3 pm, and we're open the rest of the year on the third Saturday of every month. We also have many volunteer opportunities, including working in our gardens, conducting genealogy and oral histories, accessioning artifacts, serving as docents and ambassadors to civic and community groups, making presentations to local schools and senior centers--there are so many ways you can help us build your local history museum!
