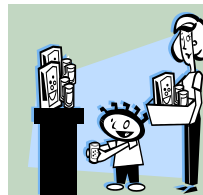

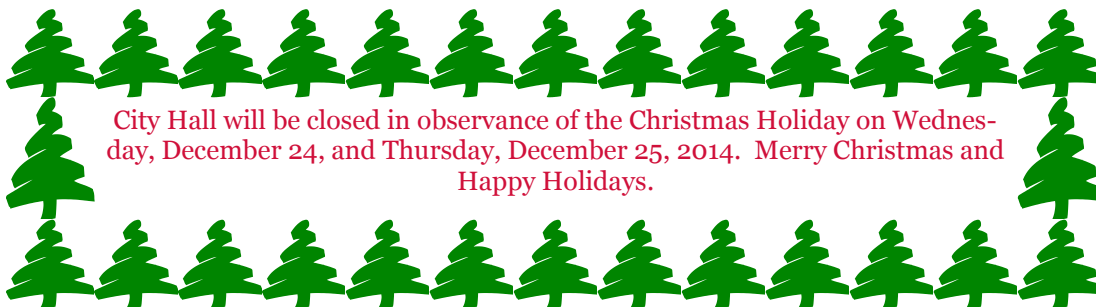

Christmas Tree Recycling



With the holiday season right around the corner, it is time to begin decorating our homes. When it comes to Christmas Trees, you might consider using a live tree that can be planted later in your yard or donated to a local school, church or other organization. If you plan on using a more traditional tree, please plan ahead to recycle it at the end of the holiday season in early January 2015. In Fairview, our local franchised hauler, Twelve Mile Disposal, will collect your Christmas trees after the holidays. Please place the undecorated tree at the curbside on your normal collection day. If the tree is over 8 feet please cut in half or break down and place in the yard debris container. Business owners and apartment managers should contact Twelve Mile Disposal at 503.661.0255 directly to make arrangements to have Christmas trees picked up and recycled. If you are a tenant, please be sure to ask your manager to arrange for this service.

FROM THE DESK OF MAYOR MIKE WEATHERBY..... Hello to all of our citizens! This will be my last column as Mayor as I am stepping down after having had the privilege of serving you for 12 years. I feel fortunate that I have been able to accomplish such things as getting 207th renamed to Fairview Parkway, putting Fairview's name on a major freeway interchange. I also established the Mayors' Business Roundtable, a quarterly lunch meeting of business leaders within Fairview and those dealing with Fairview. This allows an open communication line between businesses and the city, and an avenue to both discuss issues and concerns that they might have. Also this gives businesses both a better understanding of the city and for the city administration and Mayor and council to gain a better understanding of them. I was also glad that I was able to gain a better understanding and working relationship with Home Forward's (which used to be HAP) Oakes and Woods apartment complex resulting in their deeding a significant plot of land to add to our Fairview Woods Park. They put up cameras on the outside of the buildings to which our Police Department can connect. Finally I facilitated the creation of regular quarterly meetings chaired by the

Mayor with city officials, Oakes and Woods apartment complex management, and Home Forward officials to connect and communicate about concerns and issues. Another gain for the city that I worked long and hard at was the great improvements to Park Cleone. With a running and walking path, improved Gazebo play attractions, and a stream running through it, it is something that I encourage all of you to enjoy. Finally, I have worked hard over my tenure as your Mayor for regionalism, to build a very real and long term lasting relationship between Fairview, Troutdale and Wood Village. Through sharing services and building a working relationship between the city councils of the three cities and the staffs, we have one more tool to improve the quality of life for all of you.
