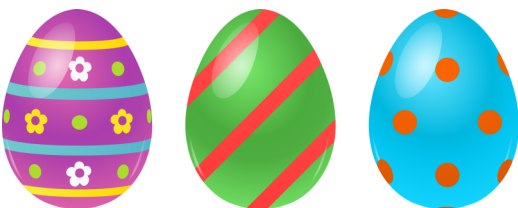

Fairview City Council Approves Development Incentive Program

The Fairview City Council has approved a Vacant Land Development Incentive Program to incentivize development on vacant land and spur economic development. The program applies to all vacant land and commercial and residential developments.

The City will grant an incentive credit of up to a maximum of 0.75% of the construction valuation for a building permit application and will waive all utility system development charges for qualifying applications. The program does have a sunset date.
