Council Accepting Applications for Halsey Corridor Community Advisory Committee

The Fairview City Council is accepting applications for residents to serve on a newly formed Community Advisory Committee (CAC). Members of this committee will oversee progress on the NE Halsey Corridor Economic Development Study – a multi-jurisdiction project that will seek to further economic development, enhance community readiness, and encourage appropriate reinvestment along NE Halsey Street from Fairview Parkway east to the Historic Columbia River Parkway in Troutdale.

The CAC will provide guidance and make decisions on milestones throughout the project. Composition of the committee will include one elected official from Fairview, Wood Village, and Troutdale plus up to three other interested parties from each of the three jurisdictions. Funded by a \$100,000 Metro grant, the Halsey Study will be guided by two stakeholder advisory committees. In addition to the CAC, a Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) will also be formed to provide technical advice on the project. Together, it is anticipated that the committees will meet 5 to 6 times throughout the year-long project.

The Cities of Fairview, Wood Village, and Troutdale will work together to form a shared 20-year plan for the Halsey Corridor that will allow for:

- Collaborative partnerships and funding strategies
- New development to attract new businesses
- Strengthen and retain existing business base

Estimated project start date is summer 2016.

FOUR CITY COUNCILOR POSITIONS ON THE NOVEMBER 8, 2016 ELECTION BALLOT



The Fairview City Council has four Councilor positions which will be on the November 8, 2016 election ballot. The positions are:

Council Position 1 - currently held by Dan Kreamier

Council Position 2 - currently held by Ed Bejarana

Council Position 3 - currently held by Steve Prom

Council Position 4 - currently held by Tamie Arnold

All elected positions are for a period of 4 years, with the exception of position four which is open due to a mid-term resignation of a prior city councilor. The person elected to position 4 will serve for the remainder of the existing term which expires on December 31, 2018.

To qualify to be a candidate an elector shall have resided in the City of Fairview for a period of 12 months immediately preceding the City election.

The first day to file for candidacy with the City Recorder is June 1, 2016 and the last day to file is August 30, 2016 by 5:00 PM.
