Hello Fairview. June 25th marked my five month anniversary with the City of Fairview as City Administrator. It has been a busy but productive time. I have grown to love the community and my opportunity to serve our City.

During my first six weeks Fairview City Council adopted six goals with 21 objectives or projects. I would like to briefly share with you the progress on two of those projects. Both include partnerships with our neighbors.

- Possible Consolidation of the Fairview Police Department (FPD) with Multnomah County Sheriff's Office (MCSO):** Mayor Ted Tosterud has appointed a four member committee that has met twice with MCSO. The Mayor has also hosted two public forums on the issue, with a third anticipated in July. The current goal is to identify the best option (consolidation or a stand-alone department) both fiscally and services provided to the community.
- Two City Recreation Program:** A committee including officials and citizens from both Fairview and Wood Village are meeting to consider development of activities that would start in the summer of 2017.

City Council Adopts FY 2016-2017 Budget

At their June 15 business meeting, the Fairview City Council unanimously adopted the approved budget for Fiscal Year 2016-2017, in the total amount of \$21,253,248. The budget reflects the City Council goals and direction as it relates to maintaining the long-term financial health and stability of the City's General Fund and reserves, and continues the delivery of high-quality services for the Fairview Community.

Highlights include the addition of a Code Compliance Officer/Associate Planner, phase 1 of Lake Shore Park improvements, further investigation to complete city-wide sidewalks, etc. The budget is on file at Fairview City Hall and available for viewing on the city website.
