Construction of improvements to a section of NE Sandy Blvd. between NE 230th Ave. and NE 238th Ave. in Fairview and Wood Village have begun. The project includes addition of turn lanes, new sidewalks and bike lanes, new pavement and drainage improvements, and enhancements to existing bus stops.
