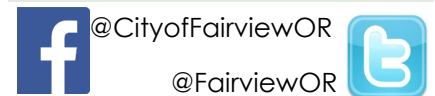

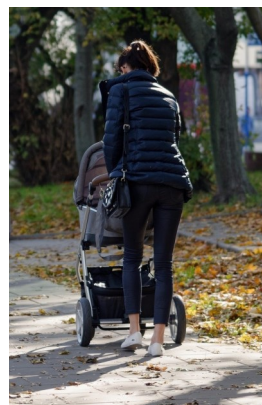


Reminder to All Property Owners:

Fairview Municipal Code states that property owners are responsible for keeping sidewalks free of hazards (including snow, ice, leaves, branches, trip hazards, etc.) and to maintain them in good condition at all times.

Street trees are only to be removed when posing a hazard and must be replanted if removed. Depending on the neighborhood, there may be specific trees requirements for replanting. An approved permit is required before removal.

Property owners found in violation of either of these might be subjected to Code Enforcement procedures.
