The start of the new year means the Fairview City Council is beginning to prepare for its annual goal setting session to develop a work plan for next fiscal year (July 2021-June 2022). This work plan helps the City Council and Budget Committee develop the annual budget and provides the City Administrator and the city's Department Director's guidance on where to direct resources for the year.



The **Council is seeking community input** in preparation for its goal setting session to be held on February 13, 2021; which may be held virtually.

Every year, the Council gathers to:

- Review and consider amendments to its Mission Statement, Core Values, and Council Goals.
- Review the progress made on the Council's current Work Plan.
- Develop a Work Plan for the new year.

The City Council and the city's senior management team is particularly excited this year as we have two new city councilors who will help broaden our perspective as we look towards the future.

Food Cart Code Ready for Public Hearing

The City is working to develop a new food cart pod at the SE corner of 223rd and Halsey. To allow this new use along NE Halsey Street, zoning code regulations are proposed to regulate for safety, aesthetics and compatibility with surrounding development, while supporting a wider choice of eating and drinking options for the community. January's Water Conservation Tip

Check for leaks. Did you know that leaks can account for up to 12 percent of indoor water use? Kick the new year off with an action that helps your household and your community reduce water waste: checking for leaks. Check for dripping faucets and showerheads, and try dropping some food coloring or a dye tablet in your toilet tank to see if it leaks through to the bowl. Then fix any leaks you find. If you need help with repairs, call a hardware store or a plumber.
