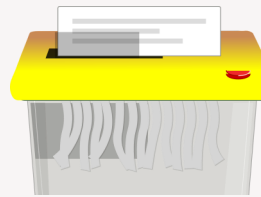

The Fairview Budget Committee will meet Monday, May 3 at 6:00 PM to deliberate over the proposed budget for fiscal year 2021-22. The meeting will continue to Monday, May 10 at 6:00 PM and may continue to an additional date, to be determined, as needed. The purpose of the May 3 meeting is to receive the budget message and hear public comment.

## Saving Water in Your Garden with Mulch

A little preparation in the spring can help your garden thrive on less water all summer long. One of the best ways to help the soil retain moisture is to apply a layer of mulch in mid- to late spring when the frosty mornings have passed. Mulch insulates the soil, reducing evaporation so you don't need to water as often. It also helps suppress weeds, which compete with your plants for water. Mulches made of natural materials will add nutrients to the soil as they break down over the season.



Wood chips or bark dust can be applied in a 3 or 4-inch layer around shrubs and young trees. Make sure to leave a few inches clear around the base of the plant to avoid trapping moisture against the trunk. A 2-inch layer of straw or shredded leaves works great in vegetable gardens. Leave grass clippings on the lawn when you mow to nourish the soil and to reduce the amount of time you need to water.

## It's Almost Here!

The week of May 10, Twelve Mile Disposal will allow up to five, 30-gallon containers or the equivalent to, on a customer's normal pick up day. Multifamily residents can leave 1 bulky item per unit in their complex's enclosure for pickup that week. A coupon for drop-off of up to two cubic yards of yard debris at Allwood Recyclers will be available in the May Fairview Point, along with additional details.
