Water Conservation Tips: December

From cooking to cleanup, look for ways to use less water in the kitchen.

- Defrost food in the fridge overnight or in the microwave instead of under running water.
- Clean fruits or vegetables in a bowl filled with water rather than washing each item individually.
- After your meal, scrape off large food scraps instead of rinsing your dishes before putting them in the dishwasher.
- Use a mesh sink strainer to collect food scraps for the compost rather than using a garbage disposal, which requires running water.
