## City Launches Digital Assistance Pilot Program

Is it a challenge to pay for internet service? Do you struggle to access the internet because you do not own a computer? If you answered yes to either of these questions, the City of Fairview's new Digital Assistance Pilot Program (DAPP) is here to help.



Using federal American Rescue Plan Act funding, DAPP will assist low-income residents overcome these issues of access and affordability by:

1. Directing residents towards available state and federal internet bill assistance funding.
2. Providing additional bill assistance to residents for whom that funding is not sufficient.
3. Providing an internet-connected device to those eligible residents who do not currently own one.

**Online crime reporting platform now available.** The online crime reporting link can be found on the main page of the Multnomah County Sheriff's Office webpage at [MCSO.US](http://MCSO.US). You will find a large link on the main page that states "**Click Here to File A Police Report.**" This link will guide you through the steps to file a report on non-emergency incidents where there is no immediate danger to people or property. The website has a list of crimes that can be reported to the online format. We ask that all emergency incidents continue to be reported to 911. We are hoping this will alleviate some of the issues with getting connected to the Bureau of Emergency Communications (BOEC) non-emergency lines 503-823-3333. BOEC has seen a dramatic increase in the non-emergency phone calls they receive, and they are working on a solution to ease the waiting time to report non-emergency crimes. We are hopeful a new process will be put in place to make it easier to report crimes very soon.



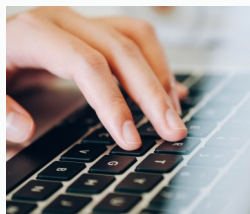
