Deadline Passes for Filing for Fairview City Council Positions

The deadline for filing for open positions on the Fairview City Council passed on Tuesday, August 28, 2012 at 5:00 p.m. The candidates for Fairview City Council for the November 6, 2012 General Election are as follows:

Positions 1, 2 and 3 have term dates of January 1, 2013– December 31, 2016. Position 4 has a term date of January 1, 2013– December 31, 2014 as per the City Charter as it is an election to fill the remainder of the term formerly held by the late Councilor Larry Cooper.

Candidates have until Friday, August 31, 2012 to withdraw.

Car Washing Tips

Here's a few simple tips on how to be kind to your car and our local streams.

Use a Commercial Car Wash

Commercial car wash facilities use water efficiently and capture and treat wash water so that it is environmentally responsible.

When Washing Your Car at Home

- Wash your car on the lawn to give your lawn a drink. The soil will help filter soap and grease.
- Use a phosphate-free, biodegradable soap.
- Avoid harsh chemical products such as chrome cleaners and degreasers (visit a commercial car wash for detailing work).
- Empty dirty car wash water onto the lawn or into a sink or tub so the water will go to the wastewater treatment plant and not in a stormdrain.
- Use a sprayer on your hose to prevent water waste.
